7. **Observation Details:** There have been two sightings in the previous week and a half of an immature YBSA in the village of Pilar. This one viewed by four birders on a snag in an abandoned field at a distance of about 100 feet. It was observed for about three minutes, but flew off just as we were putting the scope on it. Flew overhead to the top of a juniper on a hill and then dropped from view. An overall pale, brownish individual whose two-striped facial markings were clearly visible. Chin was decidedly whitish, though bird facing south into low-angled full sun. Breast pale brown, but mottling not visible at this distance. White wing-patch indistinct, but darker, blackish back with barring evident as this part of bird facing the northern light. Brown cap.

Other Observers: three other members of CBC Pilar Village team

Optics Used: binoculars, mine was a Pentax 8x42; bird had flown as I was opening scope. Darn!

Distance From Bird 100 feet Viewing Conditions: Excellent, but full-on south facing bird may have muted plumage details.
